Rainy Season Pick-Ups

Storms with heavy rainfall may cause debris to be washed onto the street or debris flows that go into waterways. Help prevent pollution caused by spillage from waste, recycling or green waste carts by taking the following steps:



- $oxedsymbol{oxed}$ Be aware of potential stormwater runoff in and around your property.
- Place bins at least two feet away from the curb so that they are not in the stormwater runoff area.
- Place bins back on your property immediately after being serviced to prevent bins from getting washed away.

Holiday "Tree-cycling"

After the holidays have come and gone, make sure to keep your holiday trees and foliage out of the landfill by taking advantage of our FREE Holiday Tree Recycling Program. VVS will collect and recycle holiday trees placed curbside on your regularly scheduled collection day from December 26, 2020 through January 8, 2021. Please be sure to follow these guidelines in preparation for recycling your trees:

- Remove all tree stands, lights, ornaments, tinsel and garland.
- √ No flocked trees.
- Trees must be cut into lengths no longer than 6 feet.



After this seasonal service has ended, holiday trees and other foliage must be cut down to fit into the standard 96-gallon green waste container (with the lid closed). If you have any questions, please contact us directly at Valley Vista Services.com/Contact-Us.

"Let's Squash Food Waste"

Did you know that pumpkins have a life after Halloween? Don't let your jack-o-lantern go to waste this year. Turn it into something useful and compost it! **Here's how:**

- 1. Remove all candles, wax, aluminum foil or other items from the pumpkin. (Remember to remove any remaining seeds as well they may later grow into unwanted new pumpkins!)
- 2. If you don't already have a compost pile, find a sunny spot in your garden to place the hollowed out pumpkin. You can also place directly inside a compost bin if you have one.
- 3. Smash it up!
 Breaking down
 the pumpkin into
 smaller pieces
 increases its
 surface area,
 which will help it to
 compost faster.



- 4. Loosely cover the pumpkin pile with carbon-rich compostable materials like leaves, sawdust and wood chips. The covering will protect the pumpkin from insects and pests while airing it out to ensure a balanced breakdown.
- 5. Let Mother Nature do the work! In a few weeks, your pumpkin will transform into nutrient-rich compost. Spread it around the plants in your garden for a special treat during the winter months.
