AB 1826: Commercial Organics Recycling

AB 1826 requires that any business or public entity generating two cubic yards of total solid waste per week, including organic waste, must:

- Separate organic waste from other waste AND
- Arrange for organic waste recycling services

AB 827: Keep It Separated

If your business is subject to Mandatory Commercial Organic Recycling as stated for AB 1826, AND you also sell food products consumed immediately on site, you must also:

- Provide recycling and organic waste bins which are easily visible, clearly labeled and easily accessible to customers.
- Recycling bins must be placed adjacent to each trash can (restroom waste bins are excluded). Businesses are responsible for providing their own bins.
- This requirement does not apply to restaurant/food establishments with back-of-the-house food disposal and collection as patrons do not dispose of waste themselves; however, full-service restaurants must provide properly labeled recycling and organic waste bins next to trash bins for employees to separate recyclables and organics for customers.

SB 1383: Edible Food Rescue

As an alternative to recycling, restaurants and other food product businesses can sell or donate excess edible food. Beginning **January 1, 2022**, SB 1383 will require certain food businesses to donate the maximum amount of edible food they would otherwise dispose, to food recovery organizations. Mandated food donors can help their communities now by starting to work with local food banks, food pantries, and other food recovery organizations and services. Los Angeles Regional Food Bank and Food Finders are great organizations that partner with local businesses and will distribute donated edible food to people in need. **To learn more about how you can start preparing for SB 1383, please visit** CalRecycle.ca.gov/Organics/SLCP/Education.



Used Oil Recycling

Did you know that used motor oil never wears out? It just gets dirty and can be recycled, cleaned, and used again. The next time you do an oil change, take your used

oil to one of the many CalRecycle Certified
Used Oil Collection Centers throughout LA
County. All Certified Centers will accept up to
5 gallons of uncontaminated used oil from the
public absolutely FREE during normal business
hours. Be sure to call ahead to find out if the
center you are visiting also accepts filters
for recycling. There is no I.D. or paperwork

effort to combat climate pollution, and address the problem of food insecurity by recovering edible food from the waste stream. As part of the requirements for SB 1383, food waste generators

will need to participate in food waste diversion programs beginning January 1, 2022, but there are steps you can start taking now to manage food waste more thoughtfully. *SaveTheFood.com* provides free resources to help get you started:
